Good news from Kenya: **Euphrasie School, Grade 4 project in agriculture**



The new school system in Kenya uses a Competency Based Curriculum (CBC). The system allows pupils/learners to develop competency and critical skills. Pupils/learners creativity is encouraged.

Agriculture is one of the subjects and this allows pupils to learn about the soil, how to take care of the environment, planting of different crops and the process of germination till fruition.

The pupils of Euphrasie School as part of their project in agriculture, have to plant seeds. Their teacher will ensure every process is followed and understood. After every process, the pupils have to record down what they have done, the why and the how. The teacher encourages the use of creativity to invoke their thinking
